An initial x-ray of Rosie's stomach showed nothing, and she was sent home under close observation.

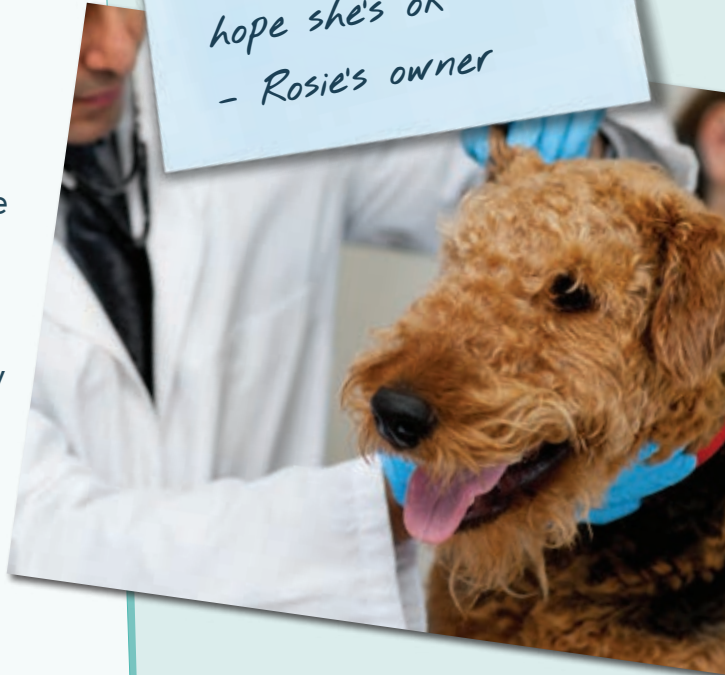
Two days later, Rosie was back in the clinic, still refusing to eat and throwing up. A second x-ray finally showed a foreign body lodged in Rosie's throat.
